HYMN #487

When Morning Gilds the Skies is an anonymous German text from c. 1800. Its exuberance is expressed in the phrase "May Jesus Christ be praised!" which appears twice in each stanza. The hymn calls us to carry Christ in our hearts and live lives of praise to God. God is to be praised in all circumstances: at work and prayer, in sadness and in the fading of earthly bliss. In so doing, we lend our voices to the eternal song sung by all nature, the "air and sea and sky," the depths of the oceans and the heights of the mountains.

HYMN #375

Lord of All Good extends our understanding of stewardship to every aspect of life. Not our gifts alone but our entire selves are to be an offering for God's service and for God's glory. In our lives as in the final stanza of the hymn, this "whole-life" stewardship is perceived as an outflowing of doxology.

HYMN #417

Christ Is Made the Sure Foundation is derived from an anonymous Latin poem of the 7th century. The original Latin hymn was found in many of the earliest Christian hymnals. Our hymn is based on the second part of the longer original and is based largely on St. Paul's description of the church in Ephesians 2:19-21.

"So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the corner stone. In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God."

The emphasis is on the Church's unity in Christ, its members being "living stones" built into him and thus joined together to form "a holy temple."

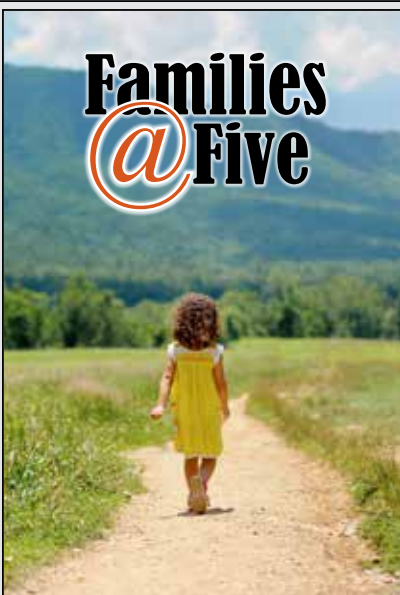

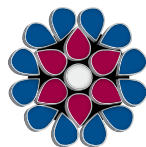
