The Ebenezer Stone: *Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing*

Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing was written by Robert Robinson at the age of twenty-three. According to hymnologist Kenneth Osbeck, throughout his teen years Robinson "was associated with a notorious gang of hoodlums and lived a debauched life." But at the age of 17, he encountered the preaching of evangelist George Whitefield and was converted to Christ. He began his ministry as a Methodist preacher, but eventually left the denomination to become a Baptist pastor. The hymn reflects Robinson's spiritual journey as it focuses on God's divine grace and providence.

The term "Ebenezer" in stanza 2 refers to the passage I Samuel 7:12: "Then Samuel took a stone and set it between Mizpah and Jeshanah, and called the name of it Ebenezer, saying, 'Hitherto hath the lord helped us'" (KJV). Ebenezer is Hebrew for "Stone of Help."

Joshua as the Second Moses

Joshua was very much the same kind of leader as Moses—in fact, strikingly so. Like Moses, Joshua led the people on a miraculous crossing, causing the waters of the Jordan River to stand still, “while all of Israel crossed over on dry land” (Josh. 3:17). . . . Joshua was in all respects a second Moses. Clearly, despite His beloved prophet’s death, God was still with the people of Israel. . . . This is not to say, of course, that under Joshua’s leadership things always turned out as they had under Moses. . . .

Symbols of Faith

Symbolic language alone is able to express the ultimate. . . . Symbols have one characteristic in common with signs: they point beyond themselves to something else, [but] a symbol participates in that to which it points. A symbol opens up levels of reality which otherwise are closed for us; it also unlocks dimensions and elements of our soul which correspond to the dimensions and elements of reality. A symbol opens up hidden depths of our own being.

Faith sees in a concrete piece of reality the ultimate ground and meaning of all reality. No piece of reality is excluded from the possibility of becoming a bearer of the holy; and almost every kind of reality has actually been considered as holy by acts of faith in groups and individuals. Such a piece of reality has, as the traditional word says, “sacramental” character. This jar of water, this piece of bread, this cup of wine, this tree, this movement of the hands, of the knees, this building, this river, this color, this word, this book, this person is the bearer of the holy. . . . Faith in the sacramental type of religion, is not the belief that something is holy and other things are not. It is the state of being grasped by the holy through a special medium.

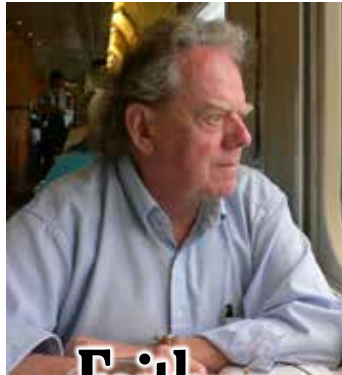
