Welcome! We are so glad to have you with us in worship this morning. If you are worshipping with us for the first time, please fill out one of the "welcome" cards in the pew rack so we may greet you and respond to any questions you might have.

Today, Dr. Galloway continues a sermon series on the last week in the life of Jesus from the Gospel of Mark. This series of sermons will lead into the season of Lent. You are encouraged to read prayerfully Mark 11 – 16 as we walk with Jesus in Jerusalem.

HYMN #138

Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty! is an early 20th century hymn written especially as an opening hymn in the Ritual for Holy Communion. The text, written to be sung after the Nicene Creed, draws from biblical passages such as Revelation 4:8-11, in which the elders give homage to God, and from the vision in Isaiah 6. Note the cosmic scope of the text: human beings (stanza 1), saints and angels in glory (stanza 2), and all creation (stanza 4) praise the name of the Lord! Though God's holiness, love and purity are cloaked in mystery, we still experience God's mercy and mighty power, and we participate in praising God.

HYMN #419

How Clear Is Our Vocation, Lord, written by hymnist Fred Pratt Green, makes note of our call from God to serve in God's creation. We acknowledge that God will walk with us, strengthening us for the tasks we face. Recognizing our inclusion in that stream of saints who have gone before, we are emboldened to complete our journey. Fred Pratt Green was a British clergyman who began writing hymns after retiring from the ministry in 1975. His poetic gift and theological insight have found wide acceptance in denominational hymnals. *The Presbyterian Hymnal* (1990) contains fifteen of his hymns, more than any other hymnist.

HYMN #376

Love Divine, All Loves Excelling is one of the over 6000 hymns written by Charles Wesley, co-founder of the movement which became the Methodist denomination. Other hymns written by Wesley include *Christ the Lord Is Risen Today*, *Hark! The Herald Angels Sing* and *Rejoice, the Lord is King*. The hymn's assertion that one can be completely cleansed of sin through God's divine love goes against the traditional Wesleyan theology as preached by Charles' brother John. The fourth verse particularly illuminates Charles' belief in our complete redemption through Christ.

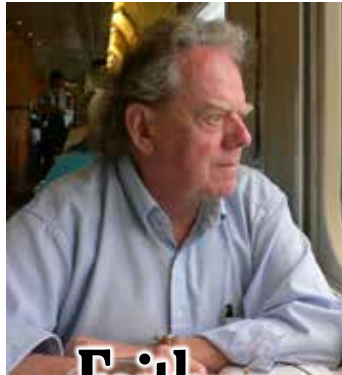
