was written in 1749 to commemorate the eleventh anniversary of the great hymn-writer Charles Wesley's conversion experience. It reflects a comment made to Wesley by Moravian leader Peter Böhler: "Had I a thousand tongues, I would praise Christ Jesus with all of them." The hymn originally had nineteen stanzas. The ones included in our hymnal focus on God's forgiveness of sin which frees us to enjoy "life and health and peace."

HYMN #442

The Church's One Foundation was written by Pastor Samuel J. Stone in 1866. There was much turmoil and theological dispute in the Anglican Church during this time. The controversies threatened to divide and ultimately destroy the denomination. In this hymn text, Stone reminds us that the unity of the Church rests on the central pillar of Christ's Lordship. While human interpretation and perspective will fluctuate, we are assured that Christ is the foundation and cornerstone. Samuel Wesley, grandson of Charles Wesley, composed the hymn tune, "Aurelia."

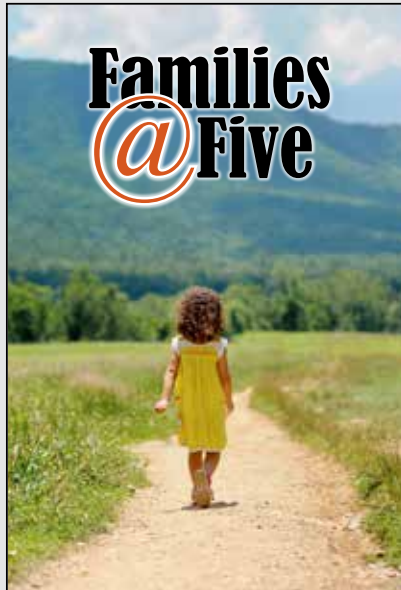
