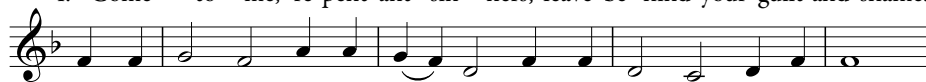

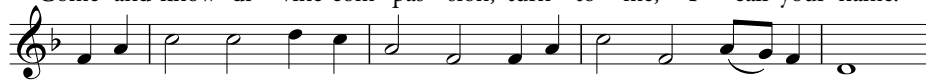

Welcome! We are so glad to have you with us in worship this morning. If you are worshipping with us for the first time, please fill out one of the "welcome" cards in the pew rack so we may greet you and respond to any questions you might have.

Today, Dr. Galloway continues a sermon series on the last week in the life of Jesus from the Gospel of Mark. This series of sermons will lead into the season of Lent. You are encouraged to read prayerfully Mark 11 – 16 as we walk with Jesus in Jerusalem.

HYMN

Come to Me, All Pilgrims Thirsty draws its inspiration from John 4:7-30 which relates Jesus' encounter at Jacob's well with the Samaritan woman, offering her the water of eternal life. Jesus is the "ever flowing fountain" that satisfies our thirst, offers us rest and refreshment as well as pardon for our sins. It was penned by Benedictine Sister Delores Dufner, one of the best-known hymn writers in the church today. She is currently liturgy director for St. Benedict Monastery in St. Joseph, Minnesota.

HYMN #462

Christ, Whose Glory Fills the Skies first appeared in 1740 in *Hymns and Sacred Poems*. This Epiphany hymn, written by Charles Wesley, is filled with images of light portraying Christ as the Messiah coming into a world of darkness. This radiant presence transforms us as it "pierces the gloom of sin" and cheers our eyes, warms our hearts. This compact three-verse hymn is tightly written in contrast to some of Wesley's hymns. For example, *O For a Thousand Tongues* originally spanned 18 stanzas. Wesley, the great English revivalist along with his brother John, wrote over 6500 hymns of which 11 appear in our hymnal.

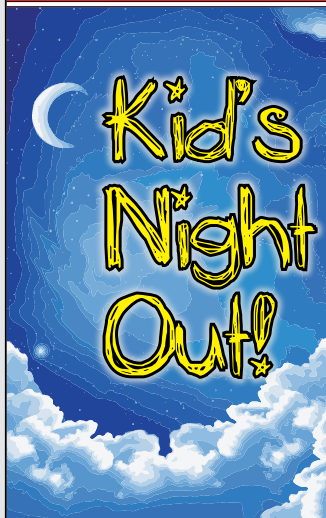

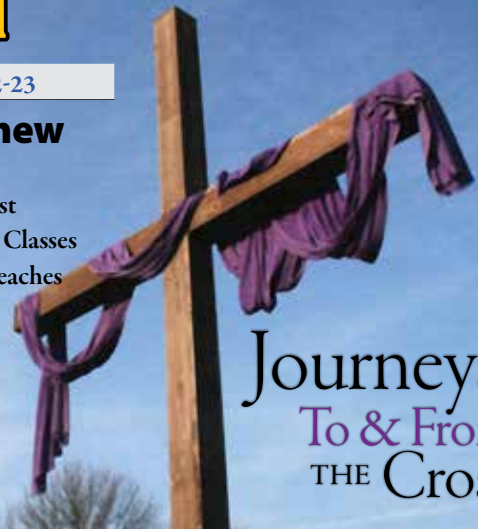
