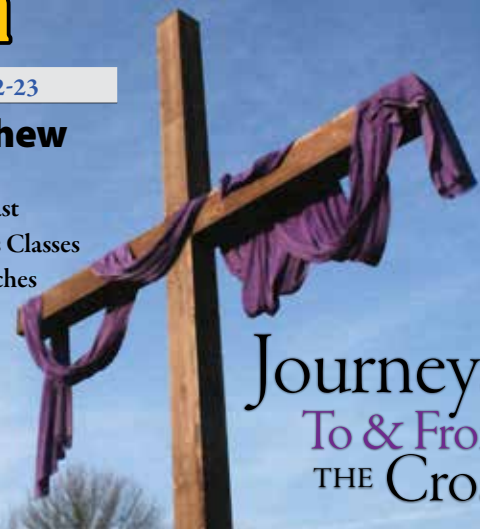

HYMN #147

Blessing and Honor Horatius Bonar has been called the "prince of Scottish hymn writers." An ordained minister in the Free Church of Scotland, he wrote over 600 hymn texts in his lifetime. *Blessing and Honor* was completed in 1866. The theme is based on the words of Jesus as he encourages the disciples to remain steadfast through the calamities of the 'end of the age': There will be signs in the sun, moon and stars. On the earth, nations will be in anguish and perplexity at the roaring and tossing of the sea. Men will faint from terror...for the heavenly bodies will be shaken. At that time they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. When these things begin to take place, stand up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is drawing near. (Luke 21:25-28) The text emphasizes God's strength and power and exhorts us to sing God's praises with equal conviction.

HYMN #229

From All That Dwell Below the Skies was written by Isaac Watts in 1719. Often called the "Father of English Hymnody," Watts wrote over 500 hymns, including *Joy to the World*, *Jesus Shall Reign*, and *Our God, Our Help in Ages Past*. Watt's poetry is a paraphrase of Psalm 117 which proclaims God as the creator of all life and celebrates the redemption, through Jesus Christ, of all people.
