HYMN

Christians, We Have Met to Worship:

The tune HOLY MANNA was originally written for the text "Brethren, We Have Met Together", one of the oldest published American folk hymns. Like many folk tunes, Holy Manna is a pentatonic melody. The hymn was originally published by William Moore in *Columbian Harmony* in 1829, and is attributed to him.

HYMN #521

You Satisfy the Hungry Heart is the result of a collaboration of poet and composer. Author Omer Westendorf references various biblical Eucharistic passages including Jesus as the great shepherd of the sheep (John 10:1-5); our worthiness as partakers of the feast (John 6:33-35); a paraphrase in stanza 3 of I Corinthians 10:16-17; the mystery of the meal; and our command to go forth into the world in Christ's name with truth and charity. Westendorf sent his poem to composer Robert E. Kreutz for a tune which resulted in "Finest Wheat." The hymn was submitted to the 41st International Eucharistic Congress held in Philadelphia, 1977. It was chosen as the best hymn among 200 entries and became the official hymn of the conference.

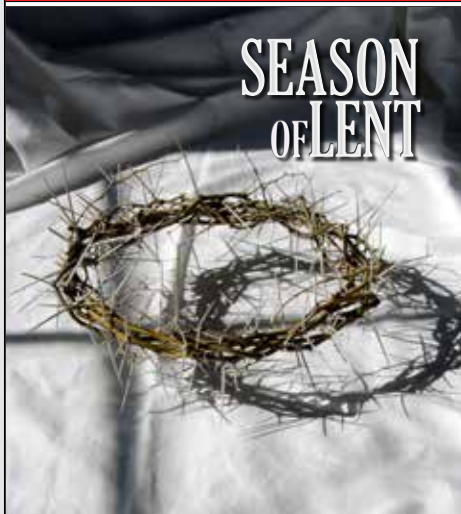
