The Eternal Moment in Time

"Certain moments in time are, for those who experience them, also moments in eternity. The trial of Jesus before Pilate is such a moment, and the Fourth Gospel depicts it with such clarity that those whose minds and hearts are quickened by the Holy Spirit can almost experience it themselves."

The event is clearly a moment in time. That Jesus of Nazareth died on a Roman cross on a Friday under sentence by a provincial official named Pontius Pilate is an undeniable fact of ancient history. That it is also an event that placed Pilate and all who ever learn of it in the presence of eternity is the uniform witness of all the writers of the New Testament and of Christians through the ages."

Pilate and All Who Would Imitate Him

Pilate is typical of the many honest, well-disposed men who would try to adopt a middle position in a struggle that is total. . . . Pilate's story illustrates how a person who refuses decisions is led to tragedy. Pilate will not face the challenge of deciding . . . And so Pilate, the would-be neutral man, is frustrated by the intensity of the participants. Having failed to listen to the truth and decide in its favor, he and all who would imitate him inevitably finish in the service of the world.

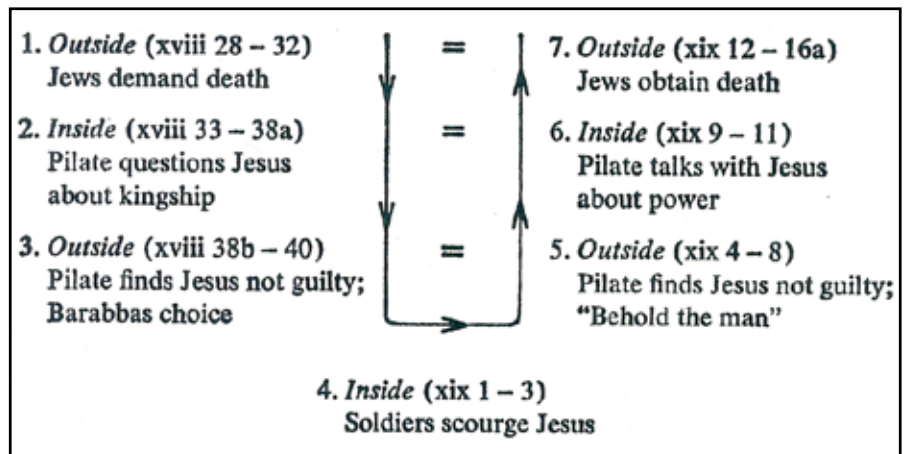

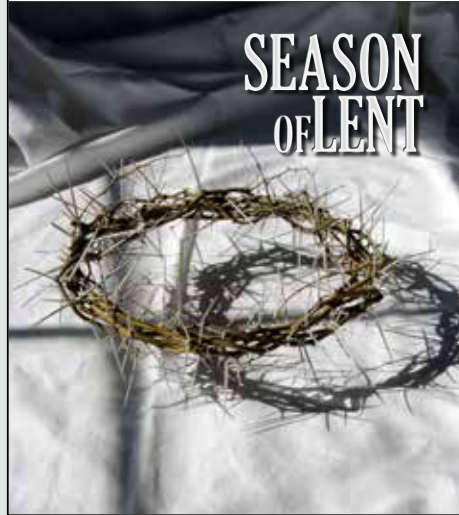
