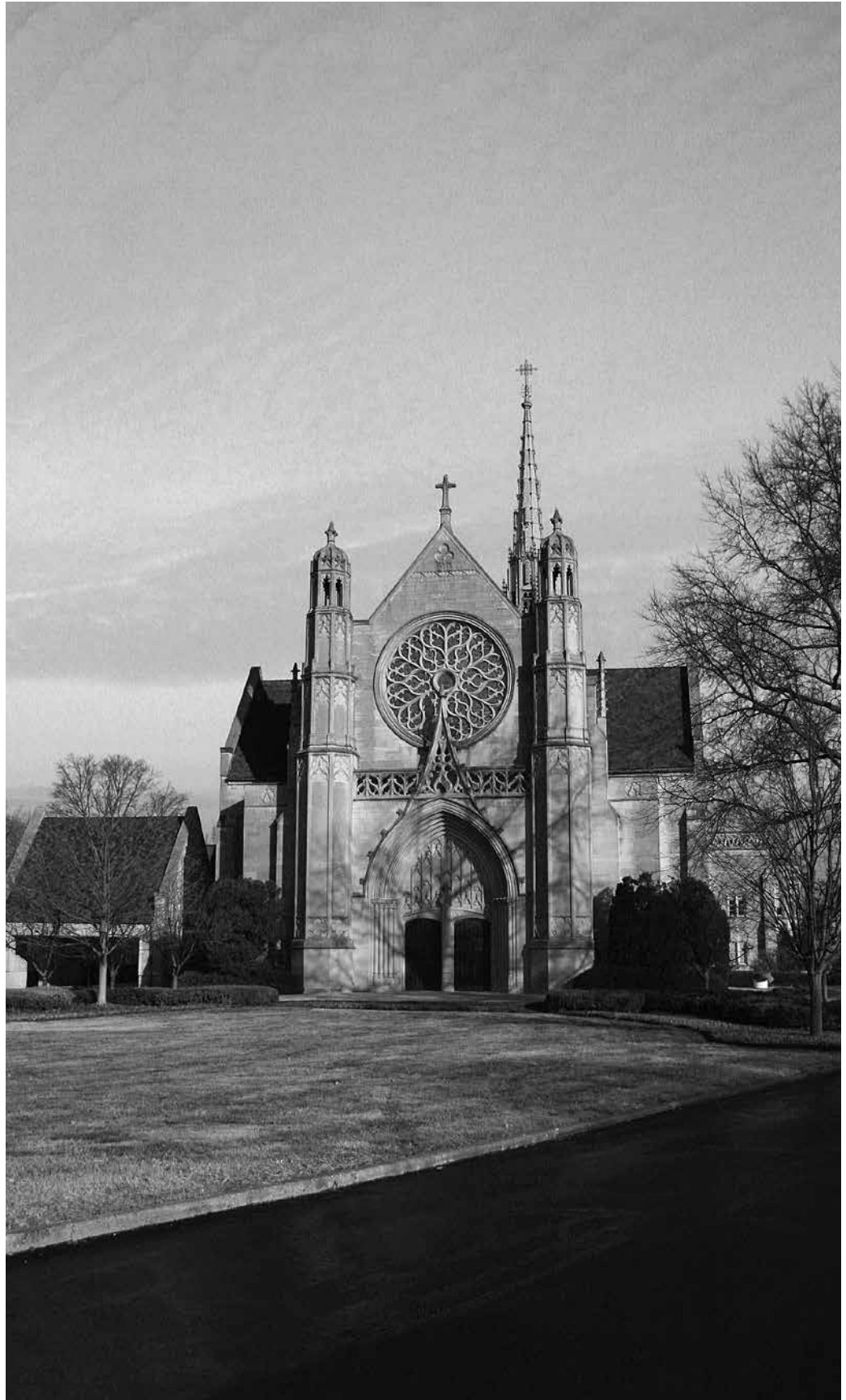

HYMN #260

A Mighty Fortress Is Our God is Martin Luther's great declaration of confidence in the inevitability of God's triumph over temptation and sin. Stanzas 1 and 2 are a paraphrase of Psalm 46:1-2. Stanzas 3 and 4 arose directly from Luther's personal experience of excommunication, persecution, and threat of death during the chaotic time of the Reformation in the early 16th century. The 'devils' to which Luther refers are physical temptation, perversion of church and state and a source of human fear and doubt. Luther musters our moral courage by reminding us that the devil will be felled by the Word, that God's truth abideth still, His kingdom is forever. In addition to writing the words to the hymn, Luther also composed the melody which has been adapted by many composers, including J.S. Bach (*Cantata #80*), Felix Mendelssohn (final movement of his fifth *Symphony*), Richard Wagner (*Emperor's March*) and R.V. Williams' film score to *49th Parallel*.

HYMN #339

Be Thou My Vision is an eighth-century text attributed to Irishman Dallan Forgaill. It was translated from the ancient Irish to English by linguist Mary E. Byrne in "Eriú," *Journal of the School of Irish Learning* in 1905 and versified seven years later by Londoner Eleanor H. Hull. While our references to God are often Trinitarian in nature, this text employs a broader variety of ascriptions for God: Vision, Lord, Best Thought, Wisdom, True Word, Heart, and Ruler.

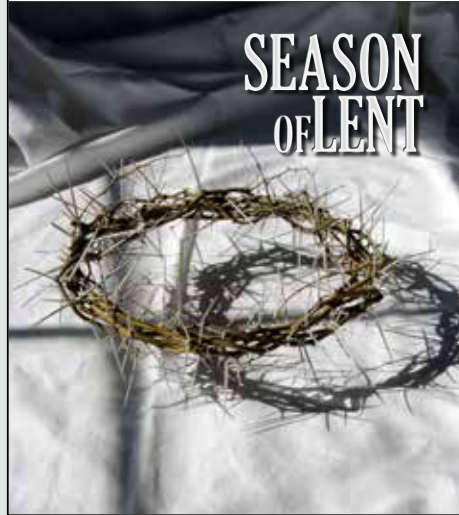
