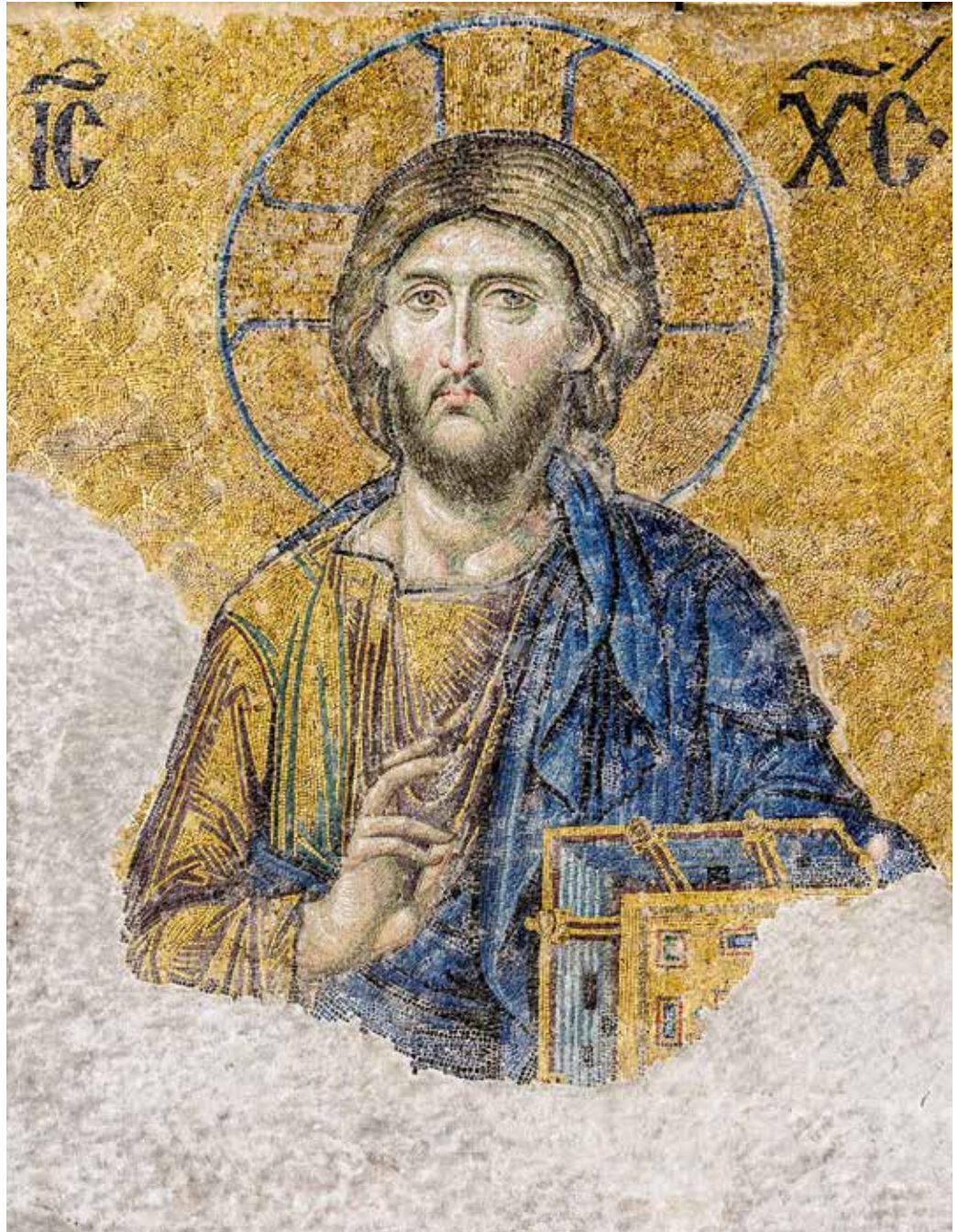

SUNDAY EVENING WORSHIP

Choral Music

The choral selections of tonight's service are taken from *Passion Week, Op. 58* by Russian Orthodox composer Alexandre Gretchaninov (1864-1956). The texts of this thirteen movement work are derived from Eastern Orthodox hymns that freely combine religious poetry with scripture. Two of the hymns (*Gladsome Light* and *Let All Mortal Flesh*) are shared by our Western tradition. Collectively, they powerfully portray the Passion Week events in the life of Christ that are at the very core of our faith.

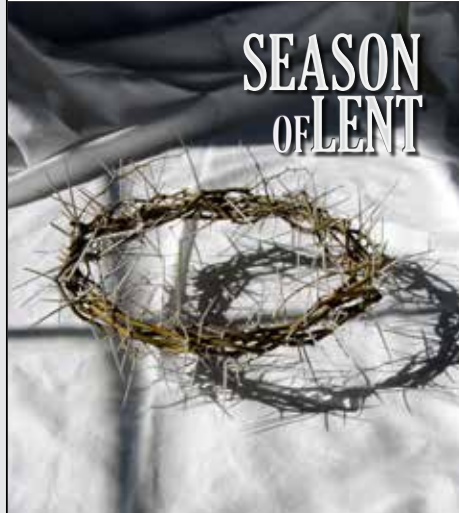
