HYMN #88

All Glory, Laud, and Honor is thought to have been written in the year 820 by Bishop Theodolph of Orleans, France. He was a well-loved pastor, theologian and poet. Towards the end of his life he was accused by the Emperor, Louis I the Pious, of conspiracy against the state and was imprisoned in the monastery at Angers. Legend has it that the Emperor was visiting the area and, passing beneath the window of Theodolph's cell, heard him singing this hymn. He was so moved by the music that he immediately ordered the bishop's release. The text, translated from the original German by John M. Neale, draws on images from three of the four gospel accounts of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem.

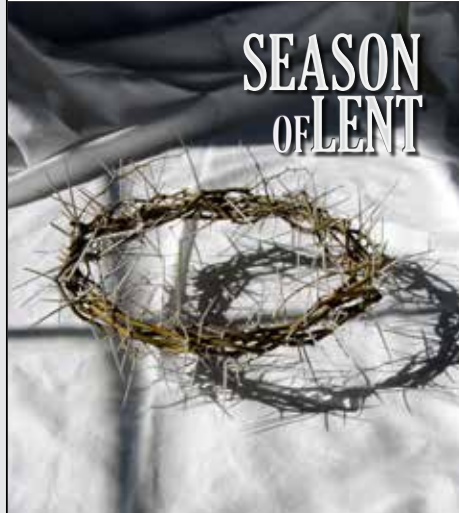
