“The Word from God: ‘Hello!’”

“Suddenly Jesus met them and said, ‘Hello!’

And they came to him, took hold of his feet, and worshiped him.”

(MATTHEW 28:9)

MATTHEW 28: 1-10

After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. But the angel said to the women, “Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, ‘He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.’ This is my message for you.” So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. Suddenly Jesus met them and said, “Hello!” And they came to him, took hold of his feet, and worshiped him. then Jesus said to them, “Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me.”

SUNDAY EVENING WORSHIP

A Reading of Matthew 28:1-10

The power of God has intervened definitively at the sepulcher of Jesus, and before it the human powers who had conspired to frustrate the resurrection are as nothing. In fear the guards are shaken even as the earth was, and they become "as if they were dead" (28:4). This is truly ironical: Jesus lives and those set to prevent that are as if dead.

The first action of the angel of the Lord whose arrival has been heralded by the earthquake is to roll back the stone and thus undo the ineffectual sealing placed on it by the order of the chief priests (27:66). . . . When the angel rolls back the stone, he does so to make it possible to see that Jesus is no longer in the place where he once lay (28:6) and therefore the resurrection had already taken place. . . .

The next task of the "angel of the Lord" is to interpret the emptiness of the sepulcher. . . . So here the angel explains that the empty sepulcher stems from Jesus' having been raised from the dead (28:7). The angel of the Lord gives the women instruction to tell the disciples that Jesus had been raised. Those disciples of Jesus forsook him and fled when he was arrested (26:56) Yet they are still in God's plan and are to receive revelation about the resurrection from the women. The women, although present at Golgotha, hitherto had only the passive role of looking on the death of Jesus from afar (27:55) and sitting opposite the sepulcher when he was buried (27:61). Now they are rewarded for their initiative in coming to see the sepulcher by being made the first human proclaimers of the resurrection and the intermediaries through whom the faith of the disciples will be rekindled.

In a further reward to the women who are joyfully obedient to the angel, Jesus appears to them. The reaction of the women to the sight of the risen Jesus is interesting. They come up (a verb Matthew often uses for expressing awe) and worship him. Certainly in that reaction they serve as a model for how Christians should respect the presence of the Lord. Furthermore, they clutch his feet. While such a gesture may underline the reality of Jesus' body . . . it also expresses human affection for Jesus. . . . A minor element in 28:10 is also interesting: while the angel told the women to report to Jesus' disciples (28:7), here the message is to go to Jesus' brothers. A new status will emerge for those who hear and believe in the resurrection: they become God's children and thus the brothers and sisters of Jesus.
