HYMN #383

My Faith Looks Up to Thee was written by Ray Palmer, a teacher at a private girls' school in New York. He had experienced a difficult year of illness and loneliness and was inspired to write this text one night after meditating on a German poem depicting a sinner kneeling before the cross of Christ.

A hymn of prayer, the text asks for forgiveness in stanza 1 and for purity of love in stanza 2. The third stanza seeks divine guidance and alludes to the difficulties of Palmer's preceding year. The hymn concludes with a hope for a safe homecoming into the eternal presence of God.

Writing later, Palmer said of the hymn, "The words for these stanzas were born out of my own soul with very little effort. I recall that I wrote the verses with tender emotion...when writing the last line, "O bear me safe above, a ransomed soul!" the thought that the whole work of redemption and salvation was involved in those words...brought me to a degree of emotion that brought abundant tears."

HYMN #108

Christ Is Alive! was written in 1968 by Dr. Brian Wren, who is currently Professor of Worship at Columbia Theological Seminary and an ordained minister in the United Reformed Church of England. Wren is particularly “interested in how public worship can be faithful to tradition yet at home in multimedia culture; in how liturgical speech can be clear, memorable and just; and in the theological importance of congregational song.” His contributions to hymnology in the twentieth-century are invaluable.

Wren reminds us in this hymn that Christ is not an inaccessible, distant, historical figure. Rather, Christ is present in our lives “here and now...touching every place and time.” Christ is with us in the midst of the often daily struggle of life. Christ suffers anew “in every insult, rift, and war.” Yet, as the final verse proclaims, Christ is triumphant.

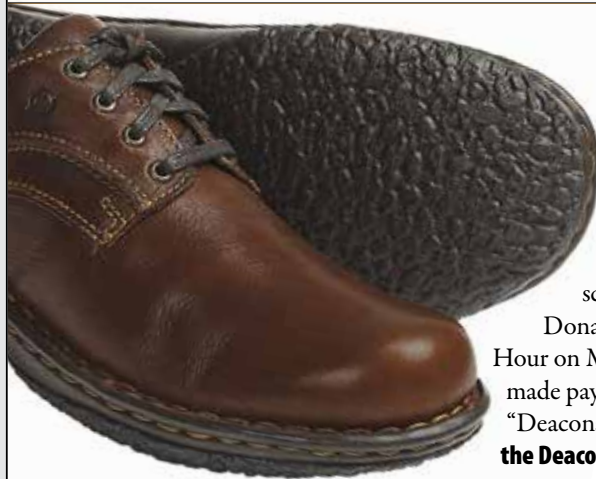


Building Servants: Redefining Community Service

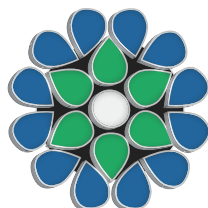


Deacons Shoe Drive
