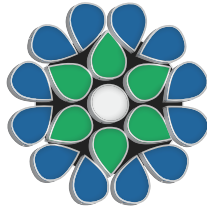

Christ Is Risen! Shout Hosanna! was written in 1986 by British hymnist Brian Wren. Its resurrection text is packed with wonderful biblical images of the newness and life which Christ brings to our world – a tree growing in the desert with "healing leaves of grace," people walking from "caverns of despair" into a morning of gladness, the triumph of Christ over the world's "demonic chorus." The singing of resurrection hymns is always appropriate in Christian worship. In a sense, every Sunday is Easter Sunday for those who follow the risen Christ.

HYMN #111

Good Christians All, Rejoice and Sing! was written by respected scholar Cyril Alington (1872-1955) specifically for the hymn tune Gelobt sei Gott to which we sing it today. Alington penned numerous hymns and poems as well as being a prolific author of fiction and non-fiction. He was ordained in the Church of England, was headmaster of Eton College in the early part of the 20th century, and finished his career as dean of Durham Cathedral. Gelobt sei Gott (translating literally as *Praise the Lord!*), was first published in 1609 and written by the noted hymn composer Melchior Vulpius (Latinized from the German *Fuchs*). Vulpius composed more than 200 hymn tunes and 400 motets mostly for use in Lutheran liturgy.

HYMN #543

Abide with Me is based on the prayer of the two disciples on the Emmaus road when, at the end of their journey, they sought to detain the stranger who had joined them. “Abide with us,” they said, “for it is towards evening, and the day is far spent.” (KJV). Thus invited, he entered their home – and there, as he broke bread before them, they recognized him as the risen and living Lord.

The hymn was written by Henry Francis Lyte with the knowledge that he was incurably ill and approaching the end of his life’s journey. He uses evening as a metaphor for the close of life, a transition from life’s “little day” to “Heaven’s morning.” The text is a prayer for God’s abiding care when friends fail, when everything seems to change and decay, when approached by the tempter, when death approaches and when we pass from this life to heaven’s glory. Although about death, the hymn is confident, hopeful, positive and serene.

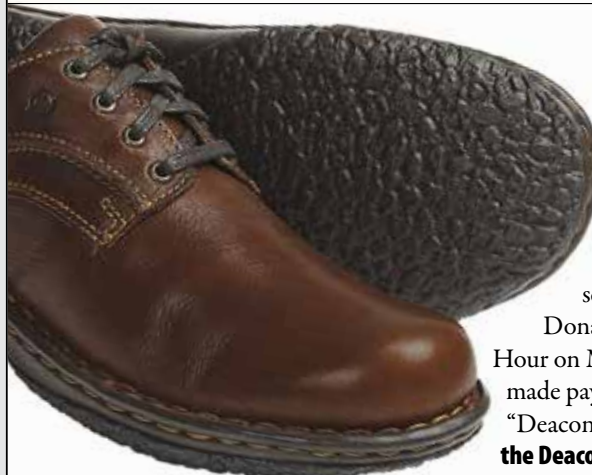
