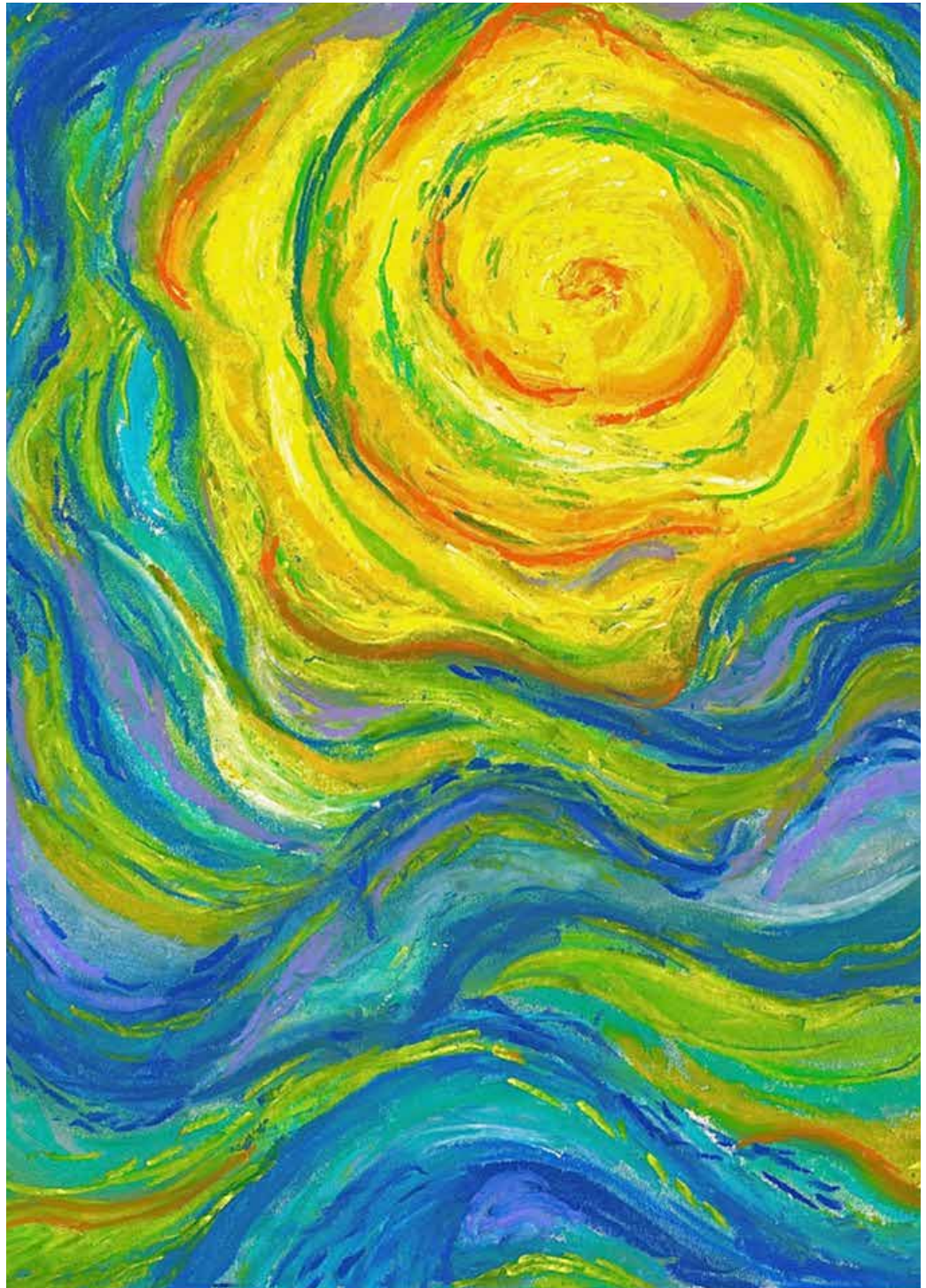

The General Assembly of the PC (U.S.A.) meets biennially and consists of commissioners elected by its 173 presbyteries. The 221st General Assembly (2014) will be held in Detroit, Michigan, June 14 - 21. The GA is full of activities: business sessions, committee meetings, an exhibit hall, daily worship services, and mission tours. The Assembly acts on hundreds of items of business received through reports of Assembly entities and through overtures from synods and presbyteries. This year, anticipated items include mission priorities, the definition of marriage, and the Israel-Palestine conflict. Everyone is welcome to this information session.

They laugh when you joke with them about needing sunscreen, and they point out the places where devastation from the war is still noticeable as well as where new construction and growth is happening. They check-in, "How you sleep?" when most have no electricity which means no A/C and no fan to facilitate a good night's sleep. They check to be sure you have enough water where there is no running water. We were invited to return to Sierra Leone. The people are proud of their home, and want to share progress with the world. Students inquire about the possibility of advancing their education, and how they can acquire scholarships for post-secondary education. Along with the people of Sierra Leone, I am hopeful for the future. I know this country can become self-sustaining through education and by providing business training and skill building. Therefore, I work with Operation Classroom (OC) to support Secondary Education in Sierra Leone. OC is a non-profit organization in Indiana that provides support for schools and scholarships for students. Additionally, OC is working to construct a new kind of education facility just outside of Freetown that will teach students entrepreneurial skills related to agriculture and construction.

If you want to know more about Sierra Leone and the civil war, I encourage you to read *A Long Way Gone* by Ishmael Beah, a former child soldier. Or check out the films, *Blood Diamond* starring Leonardo DiCaprio and a documentary titled, *Blood Diamonds*. Keep in mind, all of these descriptions focus on the atrocities of the war in Sierra Leone. I implore you to remember the joy and hope of the people in the face of the sadness illustrated in these works.

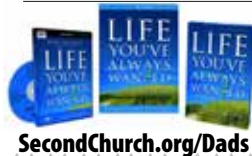

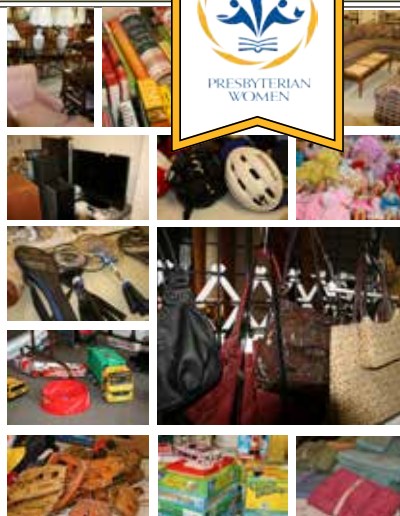
Summer Sale

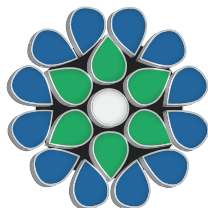
