of business received through reports of Assembly entities and through  
overtures from synods and presbyteries. This year, anticipated items include  
mission priorities, the definition of marriage, and the Israel-Palestine

### CHORAL NOTE

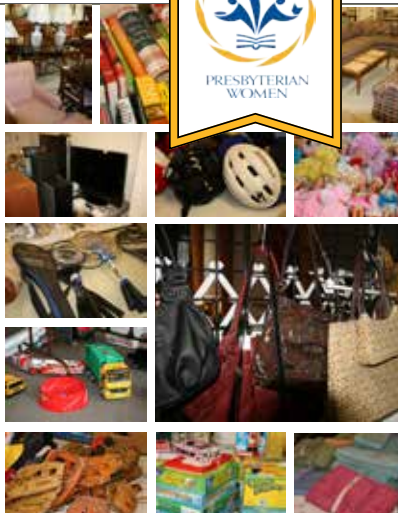
# Summer Sale

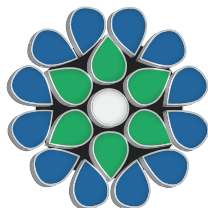
