***Sing Praise to God, Who Reigns Above***  
 is one of five hymns written by Johann Jakob Schütz (1640-1690). A civil lawyer practicing in Frankfurt am Main, Germany, Schütz was also active in the Lutheran Pietist movement. Lasting from the late 17th to the mid-18th century, Pietism arose as a response to the sacramental and confessional theology of Lutheran Orthodoxy by emphasizing the more personal and devotional aspects of the Christian life. The imagery of the third verse particularly reflects this influence.

**HYMN #419**

**How Clear Is Our Vocation**, written by noted hymnist Fred Pratt Green, makes note of our call from God to serve in God's creation. We acknowledge that God will walk with us, strengthening us for the tasks we face. Recognizing our inclusion in that stream of saints who have gone before, we are emboldened to complete our journey. Fred Pratt Green was a British clergyman who began writing hymns after retiring from the ministry in 1975. His poetic gift and theological insight have found wide acceptance in denominational hymnals. The Presbyterian Hymnal (1990) contains fifteen of his hymns, more than any other hymnist.
