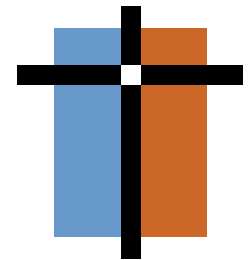

PRELUDE NOTE

Camille Saint-Saëns *Prelude and Fugue in B Major* comes from a larger collection: the *Trois Préludes et Fugues*, Op. 99. Written in 1894, they represent Saint-Saëns' first significant organ pieces for nearly thirty years. All of the preludes and fugues in Op. 99 bear dedications—E Major for Charles-Marie Widor (of *Toccata* fame); B Major for Alexandre Guilmant (a contemporary of Saint-Saëns); Eb Major for Eugène Gigout (one of Saint-Saëns' organ pupils).

Organist Andrew-John Smith relates the following regarding Saint-Saëns' compositional style: "Born in 1835, just eight years after the death of Beethoven, and dying after the First World War in 1921, Saint-Saëns saw many changes during his long life, some of which he embraced more readily than others. Up until the 1880s he was considered very modern... but [he had] adherence to classical principles and... clear conception of the parameters within which all art should function."

HYMN #138

Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty! is an early 20th century hymn written especially as an opening hymn in the Ritual for Holy Communion. The text, written to be sung after the Nicene Creed, draws from biblical passages such as Revelation 4:8-11, in which the elders give homage to God, and from the vision in Isaiah 6. Note the cosmic scope of the text: human beings (st.1), saints and angels in glory (st.2), and all creation (st.4) praise the name of the Lord! Though God's holiness, love and purity are cloaked in mystery, we still experience God's mercy and mighty power, and we participate in praising God.

HYMN #304

Jesus Loves Me!, written by Anna Bartlett Warner in 1860, first appeared in a novel written by her sister Susan Warner. They were spoken as comforting words by a Sunday School teacher to a dying child. William Bradbury adapted the poem and added the familiar refrain for inclusion in a hymnal published in 1862. The text has since been altered and now includes a reference to Matthew 19 where Jesus blesses children. "Let the little children come to me. . ."

HYMN #426

Originally titled "A Worker's Prayer", the text for **Lord, Speak to Me, That I May Speak** was written by Frances Ridley Havergal at age 36 for the use of lay helpers in the Anglican church at Winterdyne, Bewdley, England. A prolific hymnist, Havergal wrote over seventy texts, including *Take My Life and Let It Be*. Each verse prayerfully solicits Christ's guidance in living a life worthy of service. The tune was adapted from Robert Schumann's *Nachtstück*, op. 23, no. 4.

POSTLUDE NOTE

Marcel Dupré's *Prelude in B Major*, like Saint-Saëns, comes from a larger collection of *Trois Préludes et Fugues*, Op. 7. They were written when Dupré was still a student at the venerated Paris Conservatoire. Stacks of open fourths and fifths and an unwavering rhythmic drive create the brilliance of sound heard in this work.
