Stanzas three and four remind us that Jesus modeled for us a life clothed with *compassion, kindness, humility, meekness and patience*. The hymn concludes with a prayer for the peace and unity to which indeed we *were called in the one body*.

**HYMN #293**

*This Is My Father's World* was written by Presbyterian minister Maltbie Babcock whose frequent walks through the hills near his home in Lockport, New York inspired this nature hymn. The text is a confession of faith and trust, a testimony that all creation around us is the handiwork of God the Father who made creation, charged us to take good care of it and continues to exercise sovereignty over it. The phrase music of the spheres reminds us that at the dawn of creation the morning stars sang together (Job 38:7). All creatures, indeed, all creation is to make music in praise of this faithful, creator God. The tune Terra Beata was written by Franklin Sheppard. It is a derivative of an old English folk tune sung to him in his childhood by his mother.

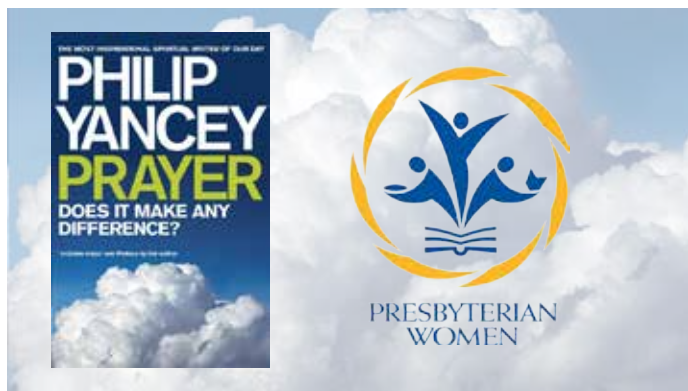

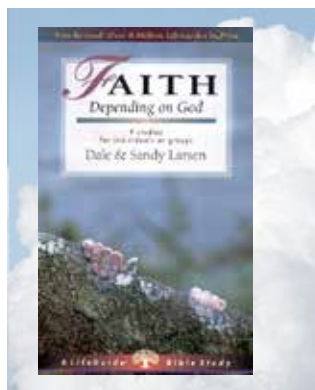

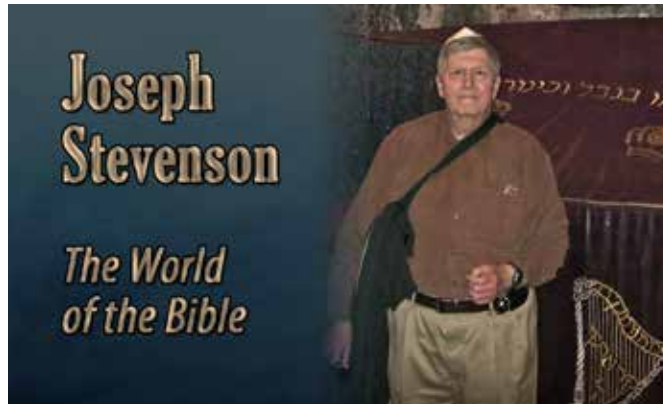
