HYMN #485

To God Be the Glory was written by the prolific gospel hymn writer Fanny J. Crosby (1820-1915), and gained great popularity after 1954 through its use in the Billy Graham crusades. In contrast to many gospel hymns, this text directs our attention away from personal experience to the glory of God. Crosby articulates the understanding that the primary element in the Christian faith is not a great imperative, that is to say, something that we should do for God. Rather, it is a great indicative, something that God has done for us. God so loved the world that he gave us his Son to make atonement for our sin. All who believe in Christ will receive pardon, will rejoice now and through all eternity because of the "great things he has done."

HYMN #462

Christ, Whose Glory Fills the Skies first appeared in 1740 in *Hymns and Sacred Poems*. This Epiphany hymn, written by Charles Wesley, is filled with images of light portraying Christ as the Messiah coming into a world of darkness. This radiant presence transforms us as it "pierces the gloom of sin" and cheers our eyes, warms our hearts. This compact three-verse hymn is tightly written in contrast to some of Wesley's hymns. For example, *O For a Thousand Tongues* originally spanned 18 stanzas. Wesley, the great English revivalist along with his brother John, wrote over 6500 hymns of which 11 appear in our hymnal.

HYMN #440

In Christ There Is No East or West is a hymn of Christian unity based on Galatians 3:28. "There is neither Jew nor Greek. There is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus." The theme of the hymn is Christian unity – and unity and mission are inextricably linked. Perhaps the most arresting thing in the hymn is its description of the Church as "one great fellowship of love throughout the whole wide earth." The phrase expresses an ideal rather than a fact; yet love for one another is Christ's own ideal for his people and the mark by which the world recognizes them as his disciples. For love is visible.

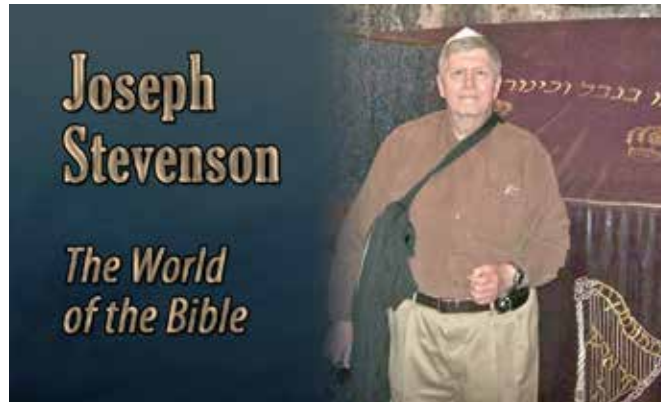

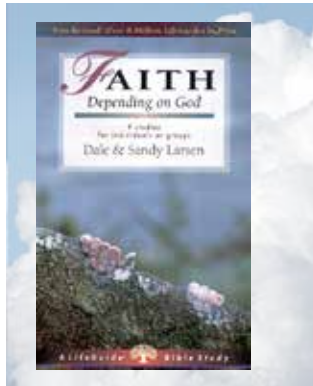
