I Greet Thee, Who My Sure Redeemer Art is attributed to John Calvin who may have adapted it from the Roman Catholic "Salve Regina." The text emphasizes many of the same themes as this morning's epistle lesson. The first two stanzas acknowledge that God is sovereign and has chosen to redeem us through Jesus Christ. Stanzas three and four remind us that Jesus modeled for us a life clothed with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness and patience. The hymn concludes with a prayer for the peace and unity to which indeed we were called in the one body.

HYMN #457

O Master, Let Me Walk with Thee

first appeared as a poem in 1879 in the magazine *Sunday Afternoon* authored by its editor, Washington Gladden (1836-1918). Its first appearance in a hymnal (*Christian Praise*) was just a year later where it was condensed to exclude a portion which, according to the author, "was not suitable for devotional purposes." Gladden was a Congregational minister serving churches in New York, Massachusetts and Ohio, and was noted for his advocacy on social and civic issues.

HYMN #376

Love Divine, All Loves Excelling is one of the over 6000 hymns written by Charles Wesley, co-founder of the movement which became the Methodist denomination. Other hymns written by Wesley include *Christ the Lord is Risen Today*, *Hark, the Herald Angels Sing* and *Rejoice! the Lord is King*. The hymn's assertion that one can be completely cleansed of sin through God's divine love goes against the traditional Wesleyan theology as preached by Charles' brother John. The fourth verse particularly illuminates Charles' belief in our complete redemption through Christ.

We will welcome the brass section of the world-renowned Pioneer Drum & Bugle Corps to 9:30/11 a.m. worship on Sunday, August 3.

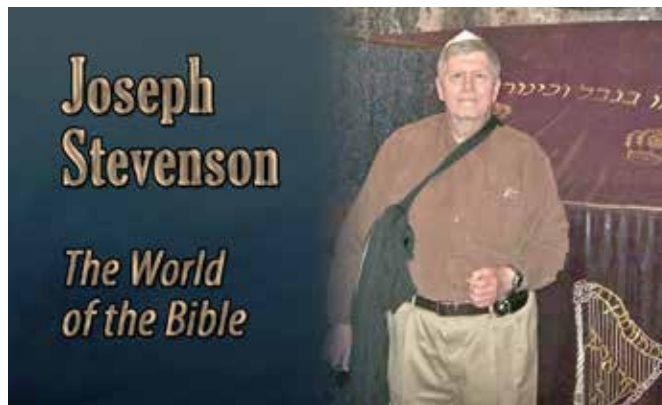
Forty-five brass players, ages 15-22 from around the world, will bring the special music that Sunday.

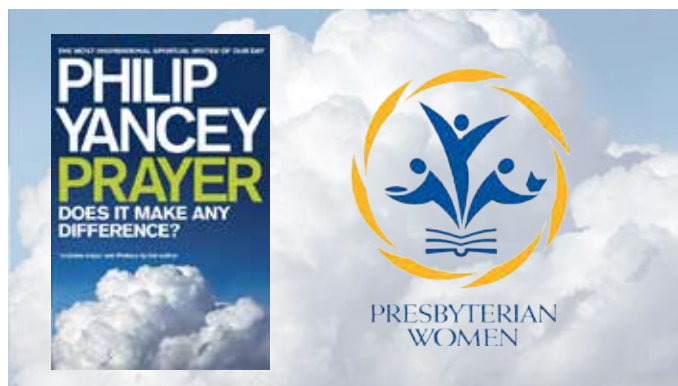

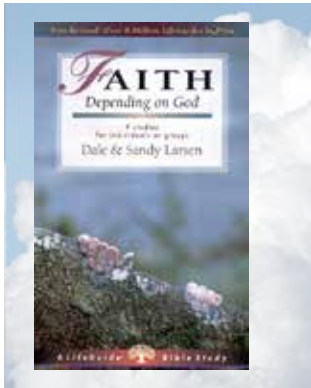

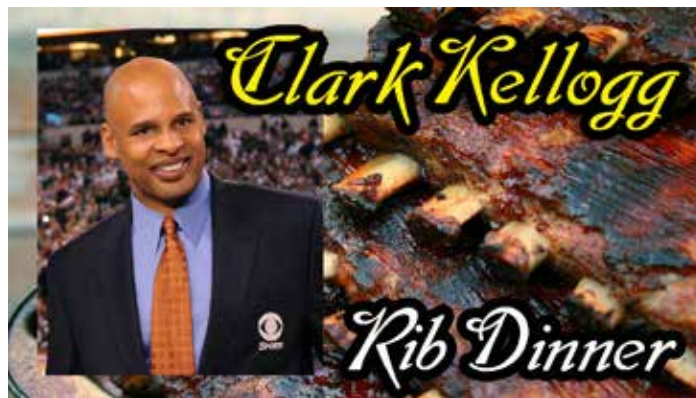
