### HYMN #229

**From All That Dwell Below the Skies** was written by Isaac Watts in 1719. Often called the "Father of English Hymnody," Watts wrote over 500 hymns, including *Joy to the World*, *Jesus Shall Reign*, and *Our God, Our Help in Ages Past*. Ineligible to attend either Oxford or Cambridge due to his Nonconformist upbringing, Watts received his advanced education from the Dissenting Academy in Stoke Newington, England. Watt's poetry is a paraphrase of Psalm 117 which proclaims God as the creator of all life and celebrates the redemption, through Jesus Christ, of all people. The hymn tune, LASST UNS ERFREUEN, first appeared in the German hymnal *Geistliche Kirchengesäng* in 1623 and was harmonized by Ralph Vaughan Williams in 1906.

**HYMN #411**

*Arise, Your Light Is Come!* was written by Ruth C. Duck for a collection of hymns adapted for inclusive language for the Ecumenical Women's Center of Chicago in 1974. Duck explains, "I was working on adapting *Rise Up, O Men of God*, when this new hymn text came to me, as if the new wine of the faith I wanted to express would not fit into the old wineskin of the earlier text." Based on Isaiah 61:1-2, the text calls us to reflect God's light in our lives, to proclaim "good tidings to the poor" and "comfort those who mourn."

### HYMN #389

***O Jesus, I Have Promised*** was written by John Bode on the occasion of the confirmation of his daughter and two sons. The word "promised" in the first stanza refers to the vows made by the confirmands. Otherwise the hymn's language draws on that of John 12:26: "Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honor." The hymn is a prayer for Christ's presence on our Christian pilgrimage – in the face of temptation and external sin (stanza 2) and internal guilt (stanza 3#). Finally the hymn reassures us that the promises we make are made in response to the promise made by Christ on our behalf.

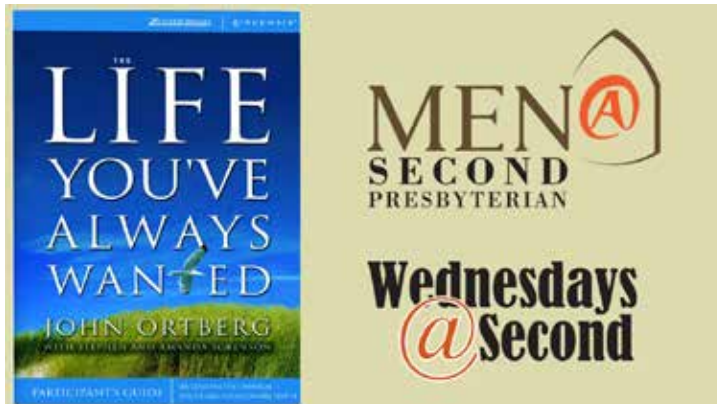

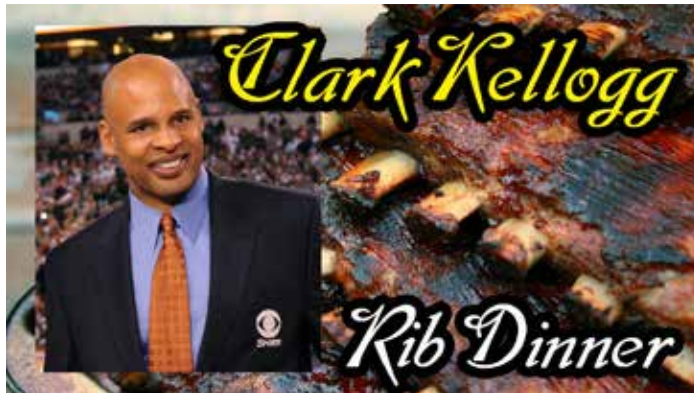
