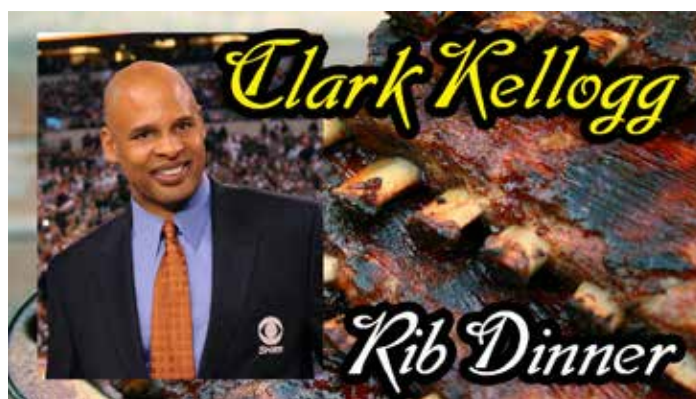

HYMN #489

Open Now Thy Gates of Beauty was written by Benjamin Schmolck (1672-1737), a prolific poet who penned more than 900 hymns. A son of a Lutheran pastor, Schmolck was born in Silesia (an historic region currently mostly in Poland). Returning from boarding school, he preached a sermon for his father which so inspired a local patron to provide him a three year stipend to study theology. Undaunted by numerous physical ailments and the severe restrictions of the Counter-Reformation, Schmolck served the last part of his life with two other pastors in a parish of one church encompassing 36 villages. One other of his hymns survives in the current Presbyterian hymnal: #493 – *Dearest Jesus, We Are Here*.

HYMN #392

Take Thou Our Minds, Dear Lord is a collaboration of two Presbyterian pastors. The tune was composed by Rev. Calvin Laufer while at a youth conference in Emporia, Kansas with no particular text in mind. He met his friend Dr. William Hiram Foulkes at a Long island train station in 1918, where he requested Foulkes to write a "devotional hymn for the young people that will challenge their hearts and minds." After hearing Laufer hum his melody, Foulkes relates that "the words of the first three stanzas came to me almost spontaneously." Three years later he added the fourth verse. In addition to several pastorates, both composer and poet held leadership roles in the Presbyterian Church USA.

HYMN #538

The text of **Lord, Dismiss Us with Thy Blessing** was ascribed to Baptist pastor John Fawcett (author of *Blest Be the Tie that Binds*) in two hymnals from 1786 and 1791 after appearing anonymously in 1773. Fawcett served several years at a small, impoverished congregation at Wainsgate in Northern England. After accepting a call to the large and influential church of Carter's Lane in London, he and his wife, on the scheduled day of departure from Wainsgate, found themselves too saddened to leave their parish and remained there for more than fifty years. Tradition states that the tune *Sicilian Mariners* was sung in unison by Sicilian ship crews at sunset with *O Sanctissima* (*O Most Holy One*) as the text.

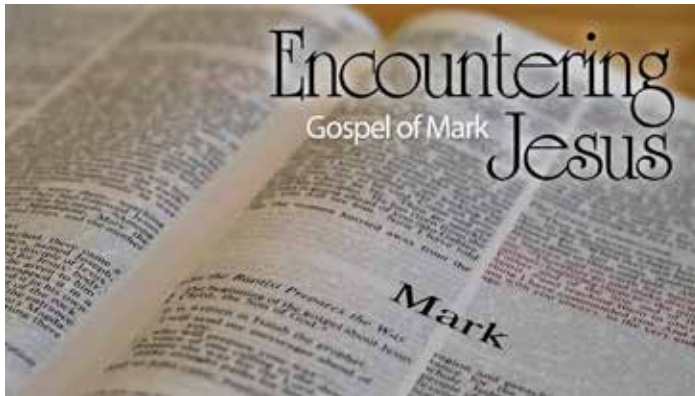

WEDNESDAYS, 6:30 PM (BEGINS SEPTEMBER 10)

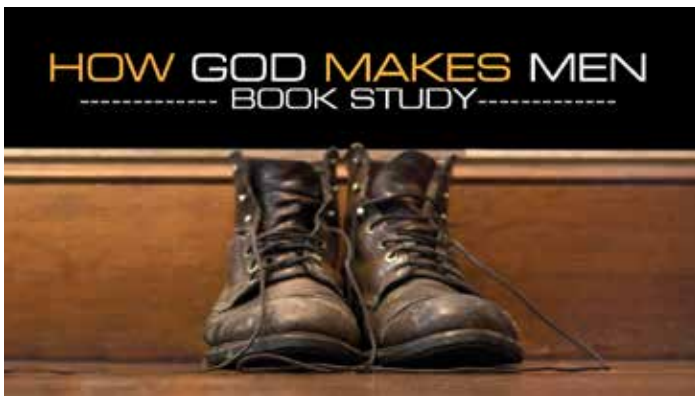

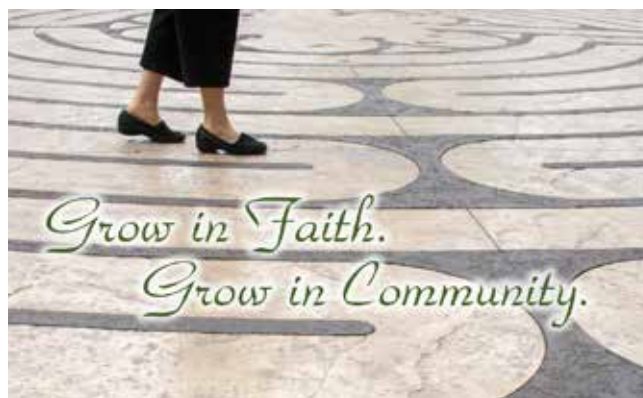
