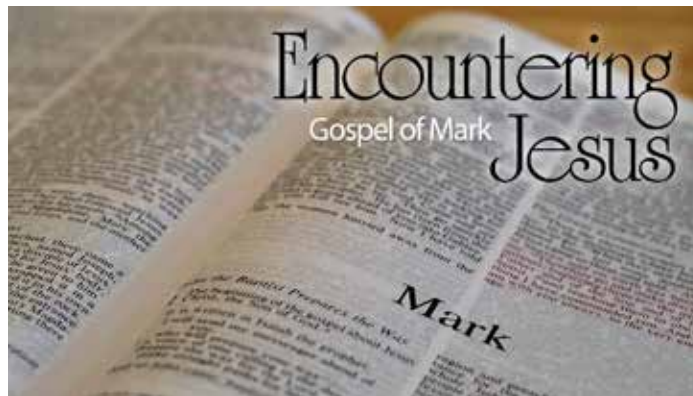

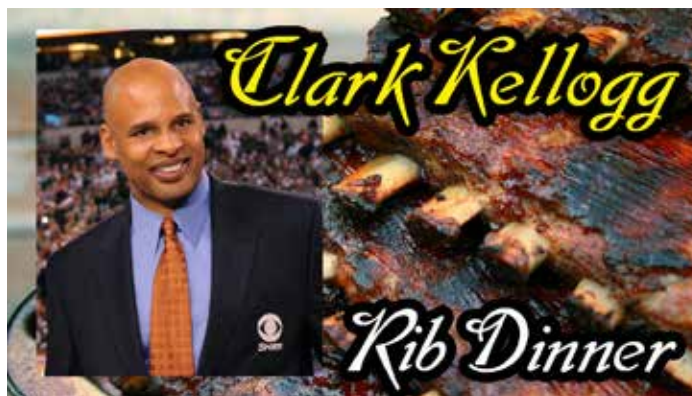

HYMN #138

Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty!

is an early 20th century hymn written as an opening hymn in the Ritual for Holy Communion. The text, written to be sung after the Nicene Creed, draws from biblical passages such as Revelation 4:8-11, in which the elders give homage to God, and from the vision in Isaiah 6. Note the cosmic scope of the text: human beings (st.1), saints and angels in glory (st.2), and all creation (st.4) praise the name of the Lord! Though God's holiness, love and purity are cloaked in mystery, we still experience God's mercy and mighty power, and participate in praising God.

HYMN #364

I Sing a Song of the Saints of God is a beloved children's hymn originating in the Anglican church. The hymn's author is Lesbia Scott who wrote the poem to help her young children understand who saints are. Scott describes saints as persons who toiled and fought and lived and died for the Lord they loved and knew. She mentions several persons drawn from scripture and church history – a doctor, a queen, a shepherdess, a soldier, and a priest and a martyr. People who fit these descriptions include St. Luke, St. Catherine, St. Joan of Arc, St. Martin, St. Peter, St. Perpetua and others. The final stanza also reminds us that we live among saints today and points out that each of us can be a saint.

HYMN #526

The text of *For All the Saints* was written by Anglican Bishop William W. How in 1864 for use in the liturgy commemorating All Saints Day. Generally celebrated on the first Sunday in November, the liturgical celebration honors the memory of those who have died within the past year. As Kenneth Osbeck notes, the liturgy also reaffirms "the glorious anticipation we have as believers of being eternally reunited with...the saints of all ages."

The tune SINE NOMINE was composed by Ralph Vaughan Williams, one of the most significant English composers of the past century. It has been observed that throughout all of music history, only two major composers wrote tunes specifically for hymn texts—J.S. Bach and Vaughan Williams.
